Annual Meeting Pulls A Crowd

Strong member turn out assures vote on bylaw amendment

aybe it was the grand prize truck giveaway. Or the \$1,000 cash prize. Or the vote on a bylaw amendment that assured no bureaucratic red lights blocking East Central Electric's roll out of its high speed fiber broadband service. Whatever the reason, cooperative members turned out for the ECE Annual Meeting, bringing spouses, children, and friends with them. At final count, 1,673 members registered at the meeting on July 25, making it the largest attendance in recent history, and easily securing the five percent of members required to conduct official co-op business.

For ECE employees who worked hard to assure a fun, well-organized event, the response was rewarding. "With a quorum we were able to hold elections and take care of important business matters. Members approved the bylaw amendment, which is good news for the cooperative," said Tim Smith, ECE general manager.

Members also re-elected Mike Vernnon, District 4 incumbent trustee, for another three-year term. District 7 incumbent Dwight Luther will also continue to serve his member constituents.

Tim Smith reported on the ecoLink fiber initiative, receiving several rounds of

applause from the crowd. Commenting on the meeting later, Smith said, "Our members are eager for service to reach them. Fiber broadband is to today's member what the light bulb was to the first co-op pioneers. It's a life changer."

As members strolled the vendor booths at the meeting, the most popular stop by far was the ecoLink fiber booth.

"There were people lined up to spin the prize wheel for a chance at free internet service and other prizes," said Amy Nix, ECE member services representative.

Other members won it big that evening, including Rebecca Autaubo of Okmulgee, winner of the 2010 Ford F-150 grand prize, and Charles Hiner of Haskell, who walked away with the \$1,000 cash prize.

August Heat Will Show In September

y September, most Oklahomans are ready to put the 100+ degree temperatures of August behind them. That's



understandable, but remember: Those high August temperatures set usage peaks for Oklahoma utilities, and caused many a home AC to work double-time to keep the home comfortable.

Please remember those hot days when you open your September electric bill. It may be higher than normal. And with September's more reasonable weather, it can be all too easy to forget those days in the sauna.

If you have questions about your usage, please log on to ECE's SmartHub. The app's monitoring tool lets you check your kilowatt-hour use in greater detail so you can see how your home —and your family members—are using electricity.

How Fiber Broadband Reaches You

here's a lot more to stringing fiber cable than tacking up a line. Take a look at our diagram, below, to better understand how data/voice will flow into your home via fiber.

Using the East Central
Electric (ECE) power
grid as its sky road, the
"backbone" fiber will hang roughly
two to four feet below the power
line. This ensures This ensures a
"safe" zone for the ecoLINK workers
who may have to repair line.

of Oklahomans lack access to internet speeds of **25 Mbps** or faster. Once ecoLink fiber is installed throughout the ECE system, co-op members will surf at speeds of **100 Mbps**—no longer be part of the underserved minority.

Notice the added equipment, such as splice cases and fiber huts. When you see these things going up in your area, get ready: The world's fastest internet service, and a world of infinite possibility, is on its way to you!

Phase II of ECE's fiber buildout is scheduled to begin in early 2020.



RECIPES



Grilled Bacon Jalapeno Wraps

INGREDIENTS

6 fresh jalapeno peppers, halved lengthwise and seeded

1 (8 oz) pkg. cream cheese 12 slices bacon

DIRECTIONS

Preheat an outdoor grill for high heat.

Spread cream cheese to fill jalapeno halves. Wrap with bacon. Secure with a toothpick.

Place on the grill, and cook until bacon is crispy.

Yield: Six servings.

Options: Mix a package of dried Ranch dressing mix with the cream cheese for a tasty twist, or try 1 Tbsp Cajun seasoning and 2 tsp garlic powder.
