# ECE District Meetings Draw A Virtual Crowd

When your coop trustees opted to play it safe and hold district meetings



online, East Central Electric (ECE) members responded in record numbers. According to co-op staff, more members registered for the District 1, 3 and 6 meetings than any previous district meeting in cooperative history. That's significant.

A final count showed 194 members registered for District 1; 211 for District 3; and 145 for District 6.

The increase in registrations sparked several members to express interest in serving on the ECE board. Some of them requested candidate packets, but only the incumbent trustees filed their intent to run.



## **Yellow Squash Casserole**

#### INGREDIENTS

4 cups sliced vellow squash  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup chopped onion 35 Ritz crackers, crushed 1 cup shredded Cheddar cheese 2 eggs, beaten

<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup milk <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup butter, melted 1 teaspoon salt ground black pepper to taste 2 tablespoons butter

#### DIRECTIONS

Preheat oven to 400°F. Place squash and onion in a large skillet over medium heat. Add small amount of water. Cover, and cook until squash is tender, about 5 minutes. Drain well, and place in a large bowl.

In a medium bowl, mix together cracker crumbs and cheese. Stir half of cracker mixture into the cooked squash and onions. In a small bowl, mix together eggs and milk, then add to squash mixture. Stir in 1/4 cup melted butter, season with salt and pepper. Spread into a 9x13 inch baking dish. Sprinkle with remaining cracker mixture, and dot with 2 tablespoons butter. Bake for 25 minutes, or until lightly browned.
